Week 7 - What is a Color-Blessed Culture? Part 3

### **SERMON RECAP:**

At Transformation Church, one of our values is multiethnic diversity. We are committed, through the Spirit's enabling power, to pursuing diversity. Through this diversity, our heart is to celebrate the unity afforded to us through the blood of Jesus. However, it's important that we know that unity is not synonymous with uniformity. There is unity in diversity, they aren't mutually exclusive!

This weekend, we talked about the role unity plays in our color-blessed culture. Because of the work of Jesus on the cross, we don't have to strong arm our way to unity. As Christ-followers, we're called to pursue and live in the unity Jesus secured through the bloody cross. We don't work for unity. Instead, we're invited to live from unity in Christ. This is only possible because of the redemptive work of Jesus. We're saved to be reconciled to God and to belong to the family of God, with shared unity in our devotion to Jesus. When dark powers try to divide God's people, we're called to guard our unity, which is only possible as we continue to rely on the Spirit of God to work in and through us. May our unity with others, even and especially within diverse contexts, be our testimony of who God is and what He has done.
