

Introduction:

The Advent season is special. It's filled with hope and expectation. In this season we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Jesus Christ as we remember His birth. At the same time, we look ahead to His second Advent, or His second coming.

The word "advent" is defined as "the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event." For Christ-followers, it's the arrival of Jesus Christ. The season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. This year, it begins on Sunday, December 1. In this guide, we encourage you to come together with family or friends each Sunday, or throughout the week, to remember what this season is all about.

How to Use This Guide:

6ather:

We encourage you to gather as a family each Sunday evening (or whenever is convenient for you) during this Advent season. Make the time special and make it a priority.

Sing:

At the top of each week's section is a QR code you can scan. This will take you to a song. Feel free to sing along or just listen.

Read:

Read through the Scriptures and devotional provided for that week. Allow each family member to share their thoughts or ask questions.

Pray:


End your time together with a prayer. You can read the one provided or make up your own.

Devotional:

The uncomfortable truth Christ-followers must learn to wrestle with is that, although we are new creations in Christ, we must undergo a process known as sanctification. This means that although we no longer carry the penalty of sin, we are still being freed from the power of sin. This is the reality we live with; we are learning and being conformed into the image of Jesus day by day. There will be times when we struggle to make the right choice or to align our actions with our beliefs. There will be times when we make mistakes. There will be times when we stumble or fall.

But here is the good news: Grace not only saves us; it also sanctifies us. Grace means there is never a moment when we can't turn to God. He is always looking at us with love and compassion. He is always holding His arms open wide, ready to embrace us. We may not understand this grace, but we don't have to. We can simply believe that it is true and allow God to love us just as we are, knowing that He will pour out His grace on us. When we have a true understanding of grace, we no longer beat ourselves up or beat up the people around us. In response to God's grace, we become gracious as well, and little by little the Holy Spirit will mold us to become more like Jesus. Jesus has done the work and advocates on our behalf; let's walk in that grace-gift.

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—thank you for the gift of grace that allows us to be in relationship with God and in relationship with one another. As we learn to unwrap and embrace the gift of grace, may we become givers of grace as well. In Jesus' name, amen.

Action Step:

Write down the words "Love Gives ME Grace" on a paper or sticky note and put it somewhere you will see it every day, like your bathroom mirror or refrigerator. Each time you see it, remember how much Jesus loves you, and remember to give yourself grace too.

What a Friend

So God created human beings in His own image. In the image of God He created them; male and female He created them. — Genesis 1:27 NLT

Devotional:

Did you know that all people are made in God's image? This is very special! One of the reasons this is special is because it means that we were created for community. Just as God has always existed in a loving community unto Himself within the Trinity (Father, Son, and Spirit), we were also created to live in community.

It's not a surprise that we live in a divided world. The division and brokenness we experience on earth happened when sin entered the world in Genesis 3. But when God sent His Son, Jesus, down to earth to live the perfect life we couldn't live, die the death He didn't deserve, and rise again on the third day, He had us in mind. When we say yes to Jesus, we receive grace, mercy, and forgiveness. We also receive new life in Christ, allowing us to have a restored relationship with God and a restored relationship with others. The blood of Jesus makes us right with God (Upward), ourselves (Inward), and our neighbors (Outward). Sin meant to divide, but Jesus came to give us fellowship (friendship or partnership) with God, ourselves, and God's multiethnic, multigenerational family. Fellowship with God and others is a gift that we can't just keep to ourselves; it's meant to be shared. Similar to the experience we have when we eat at a good restaurant and want to share it with others, we are called to do the same thing as we share about Jesus. As we celebrate King Jesus, the One who gives us friendship, may we be people who don't keep this good news to ourselves but share it freely with those in our lives through the way we live and love.

God, thank You that we don't have to do life on our own. You created us to be in fellowship (friendship, partnership) with You and others. Thank You for the gift of community and for placing us in Your multiethnic, multigenerational family. This Christmas season, help us to live an inviting life, just as we have been invited into Your greater story. Holy Spirit, show us ways we can extend a hand of friendship to those who need it. Jesus, help us to love as You have loved us. In Jesus' name, amen.

Action Mep:

Write out the name or names of someone in your community, at work, or at school that you can be intentional about building a relationship with over the next year. Take some time to pray and ask God to bring that person to mind and to open doors for conversation and connection in 2025.

Who Else

Devotional:

The moment you say yes to Jesus you are gifted eternal life. This is not a far-off reality; this is a here-and-now reality. Eternal life starts now. So knowing that we have new life in Jesus, how does this change our everyday life? One way is that the Holy Spirit lives in us and is able to offer guidance, comfort, and direction. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead now lives in us. This power gives us the ability to go out and share about the Good News of Jesus with those around us. We live on mission with Jesus to share God's love, grace, and mercy with a world that desperately needs it. We don't have to sit on the sidelines. We are active participants in the Gospel mission, no matter our age, background, ethnicity, or status.

Faith is more than believing; faith is an action. And thanks to the new life that is ours in Jesus, we are able to respond to God's call to action so that others may experience new and eternal life as well.

This Christmas season, pray for an opportunity to share about God's gift of eternal life with someone who hasn't yet experienced it. Then, be on the lookout for ways you can actively love others around you. Remember, the Holy Spirit will guide and empower you.

God, we are thankful for the new life we get to experience in Jesus. May we live in a way that is empowered by the Holy Spirit so that we can be on mission with You to spread Your love, grace, and mercy to those around us. In Jesus' name, amen.

Action Step:

Think about a neighbor, co-worker, or school friend that you can invite to participate in our Christmas Eve Services at Transformation Church. This is a great opportunity for them to hear about the gift of Life that is offered through Jesus.

Devotional:

When you think about the Christmas season, what brings you joy? Maybe it's the twinkle of Christmas lights, a cup of hot chocolate with mini marshmallows, or your favorite Christmas movie. While these things can bring us joy, there is an even greater joy we can experience that surpasses our ideal day.

When God sent His Son Jesus into the world to save us from sin, death, and evil, He knew that in Jesus we would find ultimate joy. When we say yes to Jesus, we reach the goal of our faith, as we are saved, redeemed, and reconciled back to God. That means that our relationship with God is repaired. Even though we do not see God, we believe in Him and can rejoice with inexpressible and glorious joy because we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus. This joy described in 1 Peter above is a present reality, one we can live in today.

This means that, no matter what we face, our joy is unshakable because it's not placed in situations or people that change, but in Jesus, the One who never changes. As we experience fun festivities, as well as the hard and difficult moments this season can bring, let's rejoice in the inexpressible joy we receive in Jesus and remember that joy isn't based on our circumstances; it's based on our faith in Jesus Christ.

Father, thank You for giving us the gift of joy in Jesus. Your Word says that in Your presence there is fullness of joy (Psalm 16:11). In this Christmas season, help us to set our eyes on You, and remind us that, while we may experience many joys around us, our ultimate joy is found in You. No matter the circumstances, may we remember that our joy is made complete through a relationship with You. Thank You that the joy we have in You is unshakable and unchanging, and that it exceeds any situation we may go through. In Jesus' name, amen.

Action Mep:

Take time this week to write down things that bring you joy. Maybe it's a hot cup of coffee in the morning or a song you like to listen to. Maybe it's spending time outside or over a meal with friends. Once you have your list, take time to thank God for these gifts and acknowledge that none of these things compares to the joy found in Him.
